

### Equipping through Leadership Training Classes

This year we had 82 women involved in five leadership training classes, where instruction concerning personal and ministry needs was presented. One goal we had this year was to host classes in Connecticut and Vermont. In addition to meeting this goal, we partnered with three churches that hosted our classes, two of which were new to our ministry.

The following comment is from a woman who attended our New Testament class in the spring. (The class included a review of the Dr. Carol Kaminski's Old Testament class presented in 2013). Dr. Jewel Hyun was our instructor this year.

"I had the pleasure of being able to sit in on these classes a few weeks ago. What a great introduction/explanation of the overall view of both the O.T. and N.T., but more importantly the connection between the two testaments. Jewel followed God's redemptive plan from inception through consummation, that is, Genesis through Revelation.

I loved these classes and was reassured in the direction that I am taking as I study. Jewel clearly understands what she is teaching and keeps the focus on what God is doing. Any teacher of the

One of our most popular and well attended classes this past year was presented by Rhonda Bennett, a life-coach for over 30 years. We held this class in Maine and in Connecticut. Forty-three women participated. Her topic, "Change Your Home, Change Your Life," resonated with the women who attended. Here is one woman's reflection on the training.

"All that Rhonda shared is just too good to keep to ourselves. I have already shared the message with four different people and would love to share it soon with the women from my church. I want to get a frame and place this inside: "Jan. 20, 2016-What have I done with my life, and my goals these past two years? How have I lived my life

since attending the seminar on Jan. 20, 2014?" I want to include areas like relationships, health, and ministry. I can't thank you enough; the weekend was another life-changing event." ~ Daryl

Another major milestone occurred this year. We published, "Understanding Your Personal Calling and Mission," one of our leadership training core curriculum classes. To date, this is our third published class. We anticipate much fruit from this newest "Educational Kit" to train and encourage women in their various callings.

### Together Group Ministry

This small group ministry is designed to nurture and support women as they seek to maintain a proper balance in life and to help women cultivate a network of godly friendships and mentoring relationships. These meetings include time for prayer, sharing resources and ideas, fellowship and equipping. Currently, we have six active Together groups meeting in Massachusetts and Maine, with one starting soon in Connecticut. Some groups have met for over six years now and great friendships and partnerships among ministries have resulted.

"I came to New England in 2004 from Indonesia with my husband and four children. I desperately needed some kind of support system, as I was struggling to learn all new things in New England. From culture to weather, from being a mom, a pastor's wife and a student, I was pressed by inadequacy and a sense of unending adjustment. We planted a church and also started a women's ministry that met regularly at our place. As the ministry grew, I was praying to find a circle of friendship to help me grow with a sense of accountability, but also a place where I can share my passion. Just in time, I was connected to **by design**. I came to the retreat for the first time and found a group of women who brought me such joy and inspiration for my personal journey and ministry. The best part was the follow-up when I joined my first Together Group in N. Hampton, NH.

Maybe I was the youngest one in the group and so it was a little harder at first because I was at a different season of life compared to others in the group, but as I listened, shared and experienced, I realized that was all I needed: learning from other women. I was encouraged by their story. Their journey of faith and their insights on the Word of God have enriched my own journey. Other than that there are several more blassings of being in a

that, there are several more blessings of being in a Together Group.

• First, being face to face with other women in a healthy, godly and purposeful relationship, is an ultimate need in our era where women and leaders today can easily be trapped into isolation.

Second, it contributes benefits on my own

leadership development by engaging and learning together as leaders.

My Together Group is not just a group for sharing the Word and the works of God, but also a small forum for best ideas being developed. A place for brainstorming on women and their needs, the culture and other challenges we are facing collectively as leaders. A great group where prayer is vital, and learning together with women from different Christian traditions or backgrounds is helping me understand the unity in Christ, and the uniqueness of God's design for each person and their calling. I see our Together Group as one of the pillars God has placed in my life to nurture my passion for reaching out to women, and shaping my personal growth, commitment and spiritual discipline. ### Retreat

Our annual women's retreat helps women of influence find a place of rest and refreshment. We continue to draw in many new women to the retreat, thus expanding our network of women leaders in New England. Below one woman reflects on her experience at our retreat:

"The Lord spoke to me through testimonies and wisdom from the women in my small group and round table discussion time. Cindy McDowell's message affirmed the truth that God is all I need for effective ministry. I also enjoyed the opportunity to get to know a few women from my church at a deeper level. I need to process how to keep the Lord at the center of my ministry and to make sure, on a practical, everyday basis, I am abiding in Christ. I also plan to pray for a mentor who can help me grow deeper spiritually." ~Jane

### Wings to Affirm and Uphold

We want to regularly affirm and honor those who have faithfully and whole-heartedly served the Lord month after month, and year after year.

Our Celebrate Together event, held annually at a local hotel, is one way we endeavor to show our appreciation to these women who often serve in multiple roles within their church or organization. This year's event featured author and speaker Linda Anderson. She shared insightful and practical points on trusting the Lord in difficult circumstances. It was a great stimulus for the discussion period following her talk.

Our event also offers the opportunity for other area ministries to be featured during our program. These "exhibitors" help to educate and inspire us to consider other fields for ministry. These are valued partners in our kingdom work!

We initiated the "Alice Mathews Award" two years ago. The award

formally recognizes women whose lives have exemplified five key areas described in our vision statement (See below.) This year's award went to

Lois Marshall from Ft. Square Presbyterian Church in Quincy, MA. What a delight to acknowledge dedicated women of God who have faithfully served the Lord for years.

This year 187 women were actively involved in our ministry, a slight increase from last year.

37% of those participating this year were new to our ministry.

We had a 12% increase in the number of churches represented by the women who participated in our ministry this year.

The women involved in our ministry represented all six New England states.

Over \$1,000 was donated in scholarships for women to attend events.

Increasingly, our ministry continues to involve more women from a variety of ethnic backgrounds; Indonesian, African-American and Haitian.
